motion ungenerative; that's infallible.

Duke. You are pleasant, sir, and speak apace.

Lucio. Why, what a ruthless thing is this in him, for the

rebellion of a codpiece to take away the life of a man! Would the Duke that is absent have done

this? Ere he would have hanged a man for the get-

ting a hundred bastards, he would have paid for the nursing a thousand. He had some feeling of the sport; he knew the service; and that instructed him

to mercy.

Duke. I have never heard the absent Duke much de-

tected for women; he was not inclined that way.

O sir, you are deceived. Lucio. 'Tis not possible. Duke. Who, not the Duke? Yes, your beggar of fifty; Lucio. 40 and his use was to put a ducat in her clack-dish; the Duke had crotchets in him.
